What is the WCC?

Every two years the International Federation for Information Processing (IFIP) holds the World Computer Congress (WCC). In 2010 the 21st WCC will be held in Brisbane, Australia, hosted by the Australian Computer Society (ACS).

What is IFIP?

IFIP is an umbrella organisation for national societies working in the field of IT, since 1959. Established by the United Nations, IFIP has 58 member associations in 56 countries throughout the world, with over half a million members.





The congress

The WCC 2010 will be held at the Brisbane Convention & Exhibition Centre from 20th to 23rd September 2010. The congress attracts expert presenters and thousands of delegates from around the globe.

The content

The congress combines content from commercial, industry, association and research sectors offering an opportunity to showcase and discover innovative ideas.

The content will range from the latest international research to leading commercial and industry-focused insights and thought pieces, of interest to a wide audience.
